Donald Glover

Who is the most talented person in show business in America? Although there are different opinions on this question, many would agree that Donald Glover is a possible answer. In 2017, TIME magazine even chose Donald as one of the 100 most ①influential people in the world.

Donald Glover is a black American who was born in California in 1983, and raised in Stone Mountain. From an early age, he wrote TV and movie stories, and in his high school album, other students guessed he would be a writer for the famous animated comedy series, “The Simpsons.” In 2006, he was chosen as a writer for a famous American comedy about people in New York called “30 Rock.” Most recently he created the television series, “Atlanta,” in which he also acts. “Atlanta” has won many television awards, including two Primetime Emmy Awards and two Golden Globe Awards.

Donald is also a comedian and an actor. He became famous in 2009 when he was cast as a sports athlete in the hit comedy, “Community.” His film career also has [②], and he has starred in such hit films as “Spiderman: Homecoming,” “Star Wars: A Solo Story,” and “The Lion King,” besides many smaller roles in less famous films.

If this wasn’t enough, Donald Glover is also a celebrated musician. As a youth, he began singing and writing songs when in school. Since 2011 he has been a professional musician, and when he makes music, he uses the stage name Childish Gambino. The song, “Redbone,” from his third album, “Awaken, My Love!,” received a Grammy Award, and became a Billboard Hot 100. In total, the album received four Grammy Awards, including one for Song of the Year.

Finally, Donald Glover uses his art to comment on social problems in America. In the video for his 2018 song, “This Is America,” Glover shows images connected to both gun violence in America and the treatment of black people. His TV show, “Atlanta,” also shows the problems that black Americans face every day. Although Glover’s acting and music are known for humor, he is also capable of very serious works as well. This is why he appeals to Americans, who like to laugh at their problems instead of crying about them.
