Tea

It is well known that tea is Britain's unofficial national drink. But the history of tea shows how the customs of a country can change. England [ⓐ] a country for more than a thousand years, but tea didn't become a popular drink until the middle of the 18th century.

The first recorded request for tea in English was made in 1615 by an English trader working in Japan. From the island of Hirado, he wrote to one of his colleagues who was working in Macao and asked him to send "only the best sort of chaw." Notice how close that last word is to the Japanese or Chinese word today. Over the next century the word for the drink in English moved from *tcha* and *tay*, to *tee* and finally *tea*.

'British tea' now is usually made with black tea and drunk with milk, and often sugar, added. However, this particular drink also shows a change in social customs. The heavier types of tea, like Ceylon and Assam, only became more common than Chinese teas, which are usually drunk without milk, in late 19th century Britain. That was when India, Sri Lanka and Kenya, countries then <u>druled</u> by Britain, started <u>eproducing</u> so much tea that it became cheap and plentiful.
